Major Service Programs

- Youth Scholarship Competitions: nearly \$600,000 in scholarships award annually:
 - Oratorical World Championships: thousands of students compete in local, district, regional & international competitions.
 - Communications Contest for the Deaf and Hard of Hearing: patterned after the Oratorical Contest.
 - Essay Contest: thousands of students compete in local and district events.
- Optimist International Junior Golf Championships: one of the largest and best-known junior golf programs in the world.
- Optimist Childhood Cancer Campaign: the world's premier childhood cancer eradication program.
- Youth Safety: promoting safe use of bicycles, school buses, skates and the internet.
- Tri-Star Sports: promotes physical fitness in youth.
- Youth Appreciation: recognizing local youth for their efforts in arts, athletics, academics and community service.
- Respect for Law: honoring law enforcement and public safety personnel for protecting our communities.
- Optimist Non-Violence Day: educating children and parents about violence and providing alternatives and prevention methods.
