In February, the school joined with more than 25,000 other schools throughout the United States to collect money – penny by penny – for the Leukemia and Lymphoma Society.

The Alpha Club helped out by getting collection boxes ready, distributing flyers and making sure classrooms had what they needed to get started. The JOOI Members also visited classrooms throughout the drive to collect the money raised. For almost two weeks, students in grades two through five robbed their piggy banks, gave up their birthday money and asked their parents for their spare change. When one student made a big sacrifice, it inspired their classmates to do the same!

The result? The school's goal was \$500, but the end tally was almost triple that – \$1,400!

Way ahead of the game

During this year's Souper Bowl of Caring, JOOI Members at Loving Elementary School in Detroit, Michigan, went far beyond the typical game plan to help those in need during the weeks leading up to the Super Bowl.

The Loving Eagles Junior Optimist Club decided to focus their efforts on SEASONS Ministry, a group that feeds more than 150 homeless and hungry adults and children twice a month in Detroit. The JOOI Club collected more than 870 cans of food for SEASONS.

But the JOOI volunteers did not stop there. In school, students had vocabulary lessons that revolved around hunger, and crossword puzzles, quizzes, discussions and games helped drive the point home. The school principal handled publicity for Souper Bowl of Caring, while Club Adviser Maria Davis arranged for the founder of SEASONS to speak to the JOOI Club about feeding the hungry in the Detroit area.

"The Green Bay Packers may have won the NFL Super Bowl," Club Adviser Fatima Plater said, "but the Loving Eagles JOOI Club is flying high from winning the Souper Bowl of Caring for the hungry in their community."

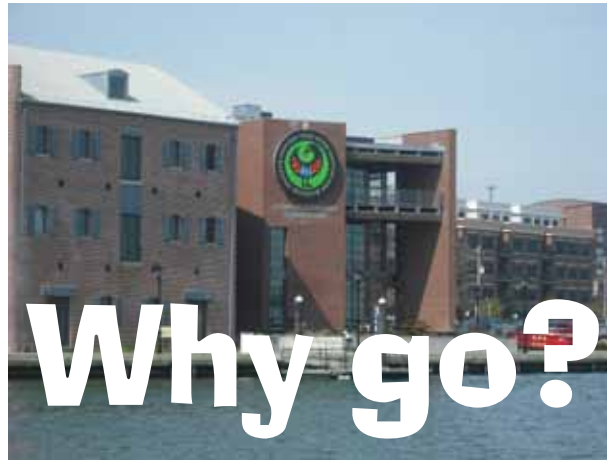

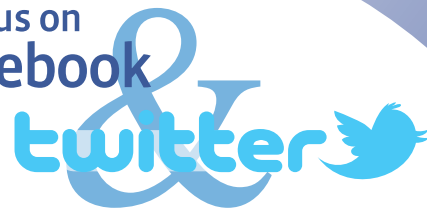
