The Optimist Junior Golf Program is an exciting way for volunteers to promote the sport of golf to the young people of their communities. Each year, more than 5,000 boys and girls compete in **Optimist qualifying tournaments**. The best of these golfers advance to the annual **Optimist International Junior Golf Championship** which offers a week of golf, the opportunity to meet new friends, top competition and a great deal of fun. The tournament is a unique golfing experience where junior golfers and their families enjoy golf, meals, off-course activities and housing all under one roof.

In November we have the **Optimist International Tournament of Champions**: a junior golf championship event for top finishers of the summer Optimist Championship, winners of Optimist District qualifiers, golfers who are included in the Top 100 overall Golfweek and Junior Golf Scoreboard rankings and other top junior golfers from around the world. This junior championship tournament is a 36-hole event for male and female junior golfers ages 11-18.

Optimist Junior Golf also offers the **Optimist Junior Golf Tour Events**: These 36-hole events are for male and female junior golfers ages 11-18. These are additional qualifiers for the Championship and ranked by Junior Golf Scoreboard. Locations include: Hilton Head, South Carolina, Myrtle Beach, South Carolina, Orlando, Florida, Denver, Colorado and Ontario Canada.

In 2019, Doral Resort and Spa located in Miami, Florida, will be the home of the Optimist International Junior Golf Championship.

## CHAMPIONSHIP POLICIES AND PROCEDURES

### Optimist Junior Golf District Chair

Optimist Junior Golf District Chairs are the central points of contact, information, and coordination for all of the Optimist-sponsored junior golf events that take place in their District. District Chairs coordinate the tournament and the promotion of Club and District events to generate interest in the Optimist Junior Golf Program. They should attend quarterly District board meetings to report and solicit support for upcoming events.

They keep the Optimist Junior Golf Department apprised of their District qualifiers. Junior golfers frequently contact the International office seeking information on how to qualify for the Optimist International Junior Golf Championship.

Districts should tailor their golf program to suit the specific needs of their localities. Some Districts hold a series of Club or Pre-Qualifying tournaments as “feeders” for the District tournament when there is an expansive geographical area or a large number of participants. Other Districts hold one qualifying tournament by accepting direct applications from players. Districts may also combine efforts with other junior tournaments instead of organizing their own events.

## IMPORTANT 2019 DATES

- January 31** Deadline for District Chairs to submit qualifying tournament logistics to Optimist International.
- May 1** At large application deadline and Registration opens for Optimist International Junior Golf Championship
- June 7** Golfers who meet the criteria as “exempt” for the Optimist International Junior Golf Championship must register.
- June 26** Deadline for submission of all District report forms; player and volunteer registration deadline to include Alternates

Optimist Junior Golf District Chairs should encourage all Clubs in their District to participate in the program by sponsoring local golfers in District tournament Clubs should also be encouraged to conduct junior golf fundraisers and provide volunteers on the day of District tournament.

### GLOSSARY OF TERMS

#### **District Qualifying Tournament**

Tournament from which junior golfers advance to Optimist International Junior Golf Championship.

#### **Pre-Qualifying Tournament**

Any tournament below the District level.

#### **District Winners**

First place boy and girl in each age category in a District qualifying tournament.

#### **District Qualifiers**

Participants in a District qualifying tournament who have met the established scoring criteria and are eligible to advance to the Optimist International Junior Golf Championship.

## District Qualifying Tournaments

Participants in the Optimist Championship are determined through Optimist District qualifying tournaments. Golfers must qualify through Optimist District qualifying tournaments unless they are eligible for an exemption or live in a District that does not offer their age division or does not offer a qualifier. If a junior golfer is unable to play in his/her District qualifying tournament, a golfer may play in several District qualifying tournaments.

Only when Districts do not sponsor qualifying tournaments are participants allowed to submit at-large applications. The deadline for a Junior Golf Chair to submit their qualifier date and location is January 31, but may be extended if chair is actively seeking a date and location and communicating with Optimist Junior Golf staff.

## Age Divisions

The age divisions for the Optimist International Junior Golf Championship age are as follows:

### **Phase 1**

Boys 10-11 Age Division\* -- does not celebrate his 12<sup>th</sup> birthday on or before July 20, 2019.  
Boys 12-13 Age Division does not celebrate his 14<sup>th</sup> birthday on or before July 20, 2019.  
Girls 10-12 Age Division\* does not celebrate her 13<sup>th</sup> birthday on or before July 20, 2019.

### **Phase 2**

Boys 14-15 Age Division does not celebrate his 16<sup>th</sup> birthday on or before July 25, 2019.  
Girls 13-14 Age Division does not celebrate her 15<sup>th</sup> birthday on or before July 25, 2019.

### **Phase 3**

Boys 16-18 Age Division\*\* does not celebrate his 19<sup>th</sup> birthday on or before July 31, 2019.  
Girls 15-18 Age Division\*\* does not celebrate her 19<sup>th</sup> birthday on or before July 31, 2019.

\*Golfers who are 9 years old as of July 20, 2019, may “play up” into the Boys 10-11 or Girls 10-12 division.

\*\*18-year-old golfers may only participate in both a District qualifier and the International Championship if they are currently in high school and a 2019 high school graduate provided he/she has not started college. Advance Placement (AP) credits in high school do not count.

### **Playing Up**

Golfers may “play up” one division, but they must qualify in the higher division unless playing in a tournament prior to December 31, 2018. A golfer playing in an Optimist Qualifier, Tournament of Champions or other Exempt Tournament **prior to December 31** plays in the age division of his current age. If he/she places as a top finisher and qualifies for the Optimist International Junior Golf Championship and ages up, he/she must play in the age division as noted under “Age Divisions”. Requests to play up two or three divisions will require a special request to Optimist International.

## Age Verification/Birth Certificates

District Chairs are responsible for verifying the ages of players participating in Club and District events. Participants should be required to provide their birth certificate as proof of age.

All international championship participants will be required to submit a copy of a birth certificate, baptismal record, drivers' license or passport to Optimist International prior to the international championship. Players must qualify in the age division that they will be playing in at the championship.

## Caddies, Carts and Push/Pull Carts

Caddies and electric carts are not allowed in the international championship. Push/pull carts are permissible in all Age Divisions boys and girls.

## Distance Measuring Devices

In this competition a player may obtain distance information by use of a distance-measuring device. If, during a stipulated round, a player uses a distance-measuring device to gauge or measure other conditions that might affect his play (e.g. elevation changes, wind speed, etc.) the player is in breach of Rule 14-3.

The use of pull carts and DMDs usage is left to the discretion of the Chair based on host site restrictions, course layout, weather conditions, etc.

## **QUALIFYING SCORING CRITERIA**

In order to qualify for the international championship, all golfers must shoot at or below an established target score in the District qualifier. The target scores by age division are listed below. All scores are in relation to par and are for 18-hole tournaments. For multiple-round tournaments, increase the amount over par accordingly. Refer to the table below to determine the exact scoring criteria based on the golf course's established par.

## District Qualifying Spots

**Each District will be granted a set number of qualifying spots in each age division.** The number of qualifying spots granted to a District are based on the number of junior golfers who participated in that District's qualifier during the year prior. The outline explains how the qualifying method works:

1. "Target numbers" for each division were established that will maximize participation levels at the international championship but allow the championship to be completed using only a morning wave of tee times.
2. The total number of golfers participating in 2018 qualifiers throughout all Optimist Districts was logged for each age division.
3. A District's percentage of overall 2018 participation was calculated for each age division.
4. The number of spots granted in 2019 (in each division) will be calculated using the percent participation figure in #3 above.

## Winners Receiving Qualifying Spots – Must meet target scores

All age division winners filling granted District qualifying spots must have shot at or below the established target score (see page 5) to be eligible to attend the international championship.

## Ties

A tiebreaker should be used to determine the District winners, ties for the last qualifying spot, and ties for alternate spots. District Chairs are encouraged to use the USGA-recommended procedure for breaking ties (Appendix I). A hole-by-hole playoff is the preferred method, but District Chairs may also implement the method of matching scores over the last nine, last six, last three or last hole. The District Chair should announce the tiebreaking method to be used before the competition starts. Please consult the pro at your host course for assistance.

## Out-of-District Golfers

If golfers from other Districts participate in your qualifying tournament, their participation will not eliminate any District residents from qualifying.

If an out-of-District golfer qualifies for one of your spots, he/she is eligible to attend the international championship in addition to the next-highest golfer who lives within the District boundaries.

## Alternates

Alternates will be admitted to the Championship if a golfer who qualifies for one of a District's designated spots decides not to attend (**The next golfer in line is the alternate whether in or out of District.**). District Chairs should determine alternates based on the tournament results and by using a tiebreaker if necessary (see information on breaking ties above).

**District Chairs should keep in close contact with their qualified players in order to offer alternates a spot if necessary. Alternates must register for the international championship by the June 26. Alternates replacing District winners are not entitled to the \$70.00 discount and must pay the full \$730.00 registration fee.**

## **Official District Tournament – Tournament weather delays / Cancellation**

A District qualifier will not be considered official unless all golfers in **an age division** complete a minimum of nine holes, in which case the tournament would revert back to the last hole completed by the entire age division. In the case of a District qualifier that is cancelled with no make-up date, golfers in said District will be eligible to submit an “at large” application directly to Optimist Junior Golf. In this situation, the number of accepted “at large” applicants in each division will be equal to the number of qualifying spots granted for the District.

## **Districts with Multiple Qualifiers**

If a District decides to offer multiple qualifiers, it is the District Chair's responsibility to divide the number of allocated qualifying spots to each of the qualifiers held.

## **Districts with No History of Holding a Qualifier or Age Division(s)**

Optimist Districts that have never held a qualifying tournament or have not offered certain age divisions in years past will be permitted to hold a qualifier. Districts in this situation will be limited to two qualifying spot per age division (except in the boys 16-18 age division where they will receive one) offered during their first year and will be included in the percentage allocation in future years.

## **Qualifying Spots for Future Years**

The Junior Golf Department will review the number of qualifying spots granted to Districts annually. The number of spots designated for future years will be directly tied to a District’s participation percentage in relation to the overall number of golfers from the year prior.

## **Suggested Course Yardages (approximate)**

The following are the approximate course yardages that will be used at the Optimist International Junior Golf Championship. It is recommended that similar yardages be used for your qualifying tournaments. Please consult the pro at the course you are using for further recommendation.

## **The At-Large Field**

Optimist Junior Golf accepts direct applications from junior golfers from the US and Canada who live in a District that does not sponsor a qualifier or that does not offer the appropriate age division. If a player has a conflict with his/her own District qualifier, he/she must choose another District qualifier in which to participate and will not be permitted to apply as an at-large participant.

The at large application deadline is May 1, 2019. A limited number of golfers in each age division will be accepted through the at-large method. Accepted at-large applicants will be notified in early May.



## EXEMPTIONS

---

Optimist Junior Golf limits the number of golfers who register for the international championship through an exemption.

Golfers who meet the following criteria will be “exempt” into the Optimist International Junior Golf Championship. Players in these categories will be guaranteed a spot in the international championship provided they register no later than June 7, 2019.

1. The top finishers in each age division from the 2018 Optimist International Junior Golf Championship as follows: Boys 10-11 (top 5); Girls 10-12 (top 5), Boys 12-13 (top 5); Girls 3-14 (top 5); Boys 14-15 (top 5); Boys 16-18 (top 8), Girls 15-18 (top 8),
2. The top finishers from the 2018 Optimist International Tournament of Champions, specifically: top 8 (Boys 16-18) and top 5 (Boys 14-15, Boys 11-13, Girls 14-18 and Girls 11-13).
3. The top finishers from the Fall 2018/Spring 2019 Optimist International Junior Golf Tour event (See website under Junior Tours Events) specifically:
4. Any previous age division champion of the Optimist Junior Golf Championship.
5. Golfers selected to the 2019 Hugh Cranford All-Scholastic team.
