Selection will be made by the Certification Board & Leadership Development Committee for admittance into the program. An invitation will be sent to selected candidates inviting them to attend the next training session.

Upon acceptance, Optimist International will send a letter with the tracking forms and list of requirements

<u>Club Trainer</u> (Requirements to become a Certified Club Trainer:)

Will be mentored by a Certified International Trainer

20 hours of presentations at Club and/or Zone Level meetings

10 hours must be on Optimist International topics

At least 1 program on the Personal Growth & Involvement (PGI) Program

Attend at least 10 hours of training (at District, International, etc.)

Develop & Present a program of your own creation (at least 30 minutes)

Program must be submitted to Optimist International

Monitored and Evaluated by District Officer and Evaluations by attendees all to be documented on a tracking form

Attain Levels 1, 2 and 3 of the PGI Program

Attend the Club Training Class at the International Convention or Regional Conference

Upon completion and review of the above requirements applicant may apply to become a Certified Club Trainer by submitting the tracking form to Optimist International Leadership Development Department and, if approved, may begin work toward certification as a Certified District Trainer

<u>District Trainer</u> (Requirements to become a Certified District Trainer)

30 additional hours of presentations at District and/or Regional level

- 15 hours must be on Personal Growth & Involvement (PGI) or other Optimist International topics
- 3 hours must be in conjunction with a Certified District Trainer with evaluation by that Trainer
- 2 hours must be in conjunction with a Certified International Trainer with evaluation by that Trainer

Present a Skills Development Module

Attend a Public Speaking Course (submit documentation, i.e., receipt, etc.)

Teach 2 Skills Development Modules or other approved (submit documentation to Leadership Development Department at Optimist International) module, one of which should be either the Creative Problem Solving or Team Building Module

Present a topic of your own creation on GROWTH (Membership, New Club Building, Retention) (at least 1 hour - can be broken down into two 30 minute presentations). Must be submitted to Optimist International.

Attain through Level 7 of the PGI Program

Attend the District Training Class at the International Convention or Regional Conference

Upon completion of the above requirements applicant may submit an application to the Certification Board for review and acceptance to become a Certified District Trainer by submitting the Tracking Form to Optimist International Leadership Development Department and, if approved, may begin work toward certification as a Certified International Trainer.

<u>International Trainer</u> (Requirements to become a Certified International Trainer)

Develop a training module of your own creation and submit to Optimist International Assist in teaching Club/District Officer training at the International Convention and be evaluated by 2 Certified International Trainers on the Certification Board Attain through Level 10 of the Personal Growth & Involvement (PGI) Program Must commit to making at least four Certified Trainer visits per year Must apply for this level to the Certification Board upon completion of the above requirements.

Must be selected by the Certification Board

<u>6 Member Certification Board</u> - to be used as a mechanism to handle the commission of the certification process.

Three year rotating commitment (2 replaced each year)

Will evaluate Trainers before they can move up to the next level

Evaluate potential Certified International Trainers at convention workshops
