

Meeting Places - Definition of

Regular meetings of Optimist clubs will be conducted in places of good repute, bearing public approval, and of a type acceptable to organizations working with youth.

The meeting places should enhance the prestige of clubs and be acceptable to speakers and guests from all walks of life. Places of doubtful reputation, which may be injurious to a club's prestige or a type to which any member might object, should be avoided.

To preserve its prestige, its position in the community, and to help maintain good public relations, clubs should not permit the sale, consumption or possession of alcoholic beverages within the confines of the room in which regular club meetings are held, or in any facility or area in which youth functions are being conducted.
